Great Things Happening at DMS!

Dunloggin math students have been hard at work, feverishly memorizing the digits of Pi for our first annual Pi Bee competition. Pi, the ratio of a circle's circumference to its diameter, is an irrational number which never repeats and never ends.

On March 14, 2019, students participated in The DMS Pi Bee in math classes across the school. The DMS Math Team would like to congratulate our winners at each grade level:

- 6th grade: Veronica Patel, who memorized 88 digits
- 7th grade: Jiya Patel, who memorized 455 digits
- 8th grade: Emily Kang, who memorized 405 digits

BioEYES at DMS: Tons of excitement in our science classes this week!

All of our 7th grade students participated in the BioEYES program this week in their science classrooms as part of the genetics unit. **We participate in this program each year with the very generous support of our PTA.** This is a K-12 education program from the Carnegie Institution for Science in which students learn about Mendelian genetics by studying zebrafish. On Monday, each group of 3 or 4 students set up a mating tank and observed their 2 adult zebrafish. The following day, they began observations of their offspring (embryos) using stereo microscopes, and they continued these observations all week. Today, most of the embryos hatched out through the chorion (egg shell) and are now larvae swimming around in the water. Our students had a chance to observe the heart beating in at least one larva, and they also observed blood circulating through the body. (These babies are optically clear.)

Some of the classes did not yet have larvae in their own petri dishes, so these classes observed their embryos under the classroom compound microscopes at 100 and 430 total magnification. Way cool to watch the heart beat at this magnification. Some of these students were even lucky enough to watch an embryo hatch.

It has been a very exciting week in our science classes. All of our students shared in the same great experience, yet the curriculum was differentiated for all academic levels of learning. This program is one example of how our teachers differentiate the subject material to meet the needs of all our students. Next week, our students will be analyzing all of their data to determine how the offspring inherited their color (wildtype or albino) from the parents.

Parents, 8th grade students will be taking the Maryland Integrated Science Assessment, MISA test on Monday, March 18, 2019 and Tuesday, March 19, 2019, during periods 1, 2, and 3. MISA, is the Maryland Integrated Science Assessment, which all students in grades 5, 8 and 11 must take. We encourage students to be in attendance on both test days to avoid being pulled for make-up. Information on MISA testing was sent home last month, in addition, their science teacher reviewed this information in class.
