#### From the Principal's Desk

The school year is off to a fantastic start. Your child has been engaged in some wonderful learning experiences. During classroom visits, I have had the opportunity to observe students testing the velocity of cars speeding down a ramp, participating in virtual geography tours, and developing/posing questions in the target language. It is evident the teachers are working to build positive learning communities that are student-centered, connected, and provide multiple pathways to instruction.

In preparation of 1<sup>st</sup> quarter interim reports, I am asking parents to continue to engage your child in an ongoing dialogue about their academic success. Ask them how their day was and what they learned. Take time to view your child's Canvas page to see the types of assignments they have been given in the 1<sup>st</sup> five weeks of school. Be sure to check their grades on those assignments and reach out to their teacher(s) to see how you can support their success at home. #### **MSDE School Climate Survey**

Dunloggin Middle School will be administering a state mandated school climate survey during the week of October 29, 2018 during Social Studies classes. The purpose of the survey is to gain valuable information about the quality and character of the school learning environment to help school administrators and teachers support student learning.
