#### Message from the School Nurse

Recently there has been an increase in our school in the number of students who are ill. In order to keep our students as healthy as possible, we ask that you assist us by keeping children home from school when they are ill. This will greatly help the spread of illness in the school.

Students who have a fever greater than 100 degrees should remain at home until their temperature is normal for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medications (Tylenol or Ibuprofen).

Students with symptoms of acute illness such as vomiting and diarrhea should also remain home until they are free from symptoms for 24 hours.

Hand washing is known to decrease the spread of infection. Please encourage your children to wash their hands frequently.
