Subject: Reminder: Please complete survey by February 10 regarding in-person or virtual learning

HCPSS has extended the deadline for parents/guardians to make the commitment regarding sending their child to school for all or part of the week (depending on program availability) and receive virtual instruction the remainder of the week, or to have their child remain fully virtual for the remainder of the 2020-2021 school year.

This extended deadline gives families additional time to review the answers to hundreds of <u>frequently asked questions about student in-person return</u> and <u>other student-related issues</u>, as well as a comprehensive new Hybrid Learning document that will be shared with staff, students and families on February 5.

If you have not already done so, please <u>complete the two-question commitment form</u> in HCPSS Connect by **5 p.m. on Wednesday, February 10**.

If a parent/guardian does not complete the commitment form by the extended February 10 deadline, the system will **default to select that the student will remain virtual** for the remainder of the year.

This is a reminder; the registration window has opened for you to begin selecting your elective courses requests. The window will remain open through February 15, 2021. We would like to clarify the performing arts courses to help you in selecting the appropriate course for your child.

Please note, these courses may be changed once we finalize students' schedules in the performing arts. Changes are made based on your child's skill level and/or performance group by our band, orchestra and chorus teachers.

You will see PE listed two times in your student's schedule to account for these two quarters of the class.

From Wilde Lake Students for Social Justice

Dear Students,

A group of Wilde Lake High School students has organized a movie night for the Black Lives Matter at School Week of Action. Black Lives Matter at School is a national group organizing for racial justice in education. The movie night will take place on **Friday**, **February 5th at 5:00 pm**. There are two options of movies to watch. The first option is the movie *Our Friend, Martin,* rated TV-G. It is a one-hour movie that "offers highlights and lowlights of Martin Luther King Jr.'s life and work through the eyes of a group of middle-school classmates." Before watching the movie, students will watch a movie short called *The Snowy Day,* rated for all. *The Snowy Day* features Peter, an African American boy, who explores his neighborhood after the season's first snowfall. If you choose this option, the event will end at 6:30 pm and you can join using the Google Meet code **wlhs-justice**.

The second option is the movie *Selma*, rated PG-13. It is a two-hour movie "based on the 1965 Selma to Montgomery voting rights marches initiated and directed by James Bevel and led by Martin Luther King Jr., Hosea Williams, and John Lewis." Before watching the movie, students will watch a movie short called *Cops and Robbers*, rated PG-13. In *Cops and Robbers*, "animation and activism unite in this multimedia spoken-word response to police brutality and racial injustice."
