Dear DMS Families,

It has been almost a year since students walked the halls of DMS. This week as we opened the doors again to welcome our Group E students, it was an overwhelming feeling. The staff was excited and eager to see the students for the first time. It marked the beginning signs of normalcy for all of us during this pandemic. I am so very proud of our amazing teachers as they pivoted to hybrid instruction this week. It truly speaks to the resilience they have displayed throughout this unprecedented time.

This week, students and families received notification of their group designation (A or B) and their official return to in-person learning date.

Group A students will attend on Monday/Tuesday and your first day in person will be:

- Monday, March 29: Grades 3-5; Grade 6; Grades 9, 12 and students attending programs at ARL
- Monday, April 12: Grades 7-8; Grades 10-12

Group B students' will attend on Thursday/Friday and your first day in person will be:

- **Thursday**, **April 1**: Grades 3-5; **Grade 6**; Grades 9, 12 and students attending programs at ARL
- Thursday, April 15: Grades 7-8; Grades 10-11

Parents/guardians may view your child's group designation at any time by taking the following steps:

- 1. Log in to HCPSS Connect Synergy using parent/guardian credentials
- 2. Select Student Info from the left panel
- 3. Scroll down to the Other Data section to see the Student group for the attendance field.

If after logging in you do not see the options, please confirm you are logged in with your credentials and not as your child. All entries will be juried at the school level before being sent to the county level for consideration. Selected writing and photographs will be published in this year's edition of Our Voice.
