# **Google Meet Expectations**

As a follow up to yesterday's communication, we are asking parents and guardians to review the following expectations with your children to ensure they are aware of their responsibilities as active and engaged learners in Google Meets.

- Follow the behavioral expectations for Google Meet sessions and directions provided by their teachers. Nobody should share Google Meet URLs or access telephone numbers with other students who are not in the class or with any other individuals.
- Every student has an HCPSS account, regardless of whether they are using an HCPSS device, and must use that account rather than a personal account to log into Google Meet sessions. Unknown individuals will not be permitted entry into the session.
- Any student having difficulties with access should contact their teacher directly to
  resolve the issue. Our staff are here to support students and will work toward providing
  a solution. If an HCPSS staff member is not present when a student enters a Google
  Meet session, the student should immediately exit the session, contact the teacher and
  monitor Canvas for a notice from the teacher.

HCPSS students must follow the expectations set forth in the <u>Student Code of Conduct</u>, which also identifies appropriate disciplinary consequences in the event of violations.

#### **Family File**

To date, DMS has **206** families that have not verified or updated their personal information in Family File. This information is still vitally important in the virtual learning environment. Today, an email was sent to all families that haven't verified or updated their personal information in the Family File. If you received an email, please log into <u>HCPSS Connect</u> to update your information in the Family File.

This information must be verified or updated annually even if you do not have changes. Be sure to transition through each screen and click submit at the end in order for your Family File to be considered complete.
