DMS Absence Email – Need to Report an Absence? Early Dismissal?

Parents/Guardians, if your child is absent, late, or leaving early from school, please send all attendance notes to <u>DMSAbsence@hcpss.org</u> and include:

- Student First and Last Name
- Grade
- Indicate the reason for absence, lateness or early dismissal
 - **Absence/Late Arrival**: include the number of day(s) and/or time the student missed school, and reason
 - Early Dismissal: indicate the time, reason, and if they will return
- Parent/Guardian first and last name, phone number and email address (in Family File)

In the subject line of the email indicate if you are requesting an absence, late arrival or an early dismissal. Parents/guardians picking their student up for an early dismissal must sign them out in the front office and show proof of identification before the student will be released. If a family member or friend is picking up your student, they must be listed as an emergency contact in Family File.

If you have advance notice of an absence, late arrival, or an early dismissal, we ask that you email <u>DMSAbsence@hcpss.org</u> as soon as you become aware. All attendance notes must be received within 3 to 5 days of absence or otherwise it will be recorded as unexcused.

Instructional Supports for Students in Quarantine

Students who must quarantine have several <u>opportunities to continue learning and receive</u> <u>supports</u>, which will help them easily transition back to instruction once they return to school.

Student/Family Chromebook Responsibilities

Beginning Monday, September 13, HCPSS will charge families for lost, stolen or damaged devices. <u>Details on how families can report a device incident and how charges will be handled</u> can be found online.

MCAP Testing

Dunloggin Middle School students will participate in the early fall Maryland Comprehensive Assessment Program (MCAP) during the window of September 15 – October 3, 2021. Each student will be assessed in English Language Arts/Literacy (ELA/L) and Mathematics. Sixth graders will also be assessed in Science (Maryland Integrated Science Assessment) in addition to ELA and Math. Students will need headphones that can be plugged into the side of the Chromebook for ELA testing. Students <u>cannot</u> use wireless AirPods or other wireless headphone devices.
